Acute Effects

Eyes: Corrosive to eyes. Causes burns. Inflammation of the eye is characterized by redness, watering and itching. **Skin:** Corrosive to skin. Causes burns. Skin inflammation is characterized by itching, scaling, or reddening.

Inhalation: May give off gas, vapor or dust that is very irritating or corrosive to the respiratory system. Exposure can cause coughing, chest pains and difficulty in breathing.

Ingestion: Harmful is swallowed. May cause burns to mouth, throat and stomach. Ingestion may cause erosion of mucous membranes and perforation of the esophagus of stomach.

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First Aid Measures **Eye Contact:** Check for and remove any contact lenses. Flush with large quantities of water, holding eyelids open for 15 minutes. Seek medical attention immediately.

Skin Contact: Wash skin with copious amounts of water. Seek medical attention immediately.

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air. Seek medical attention immediately.

Ingestion: Do not induce vomiting. Drink copious amounts of water. Seek medical attention immediately.

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Fire Fighting Measures

Suitable Fire Extinguishing Media: Use water spray, fog or foam

Specific Hazards Arising from the Chemical: In a fire or if heated, a pressure increase will occur and the container may burst.

Hazardous Thermal Decomposition Products: Decomposition products may include following materials; Carbon Dioxides, Carbon Monoxides, Hazardous gases. Hydrogen chloride (HCI), Chlorine gas.

Specific Fire-Fighting Methods: Promptly isolate the scene by removing all persons from the vicinity of the incident if there is a fire. No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training. **Specific Protective Equipment for Fire-Fighters:** Fire-Fighters should wear appropriate protective equipment and self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) with a full face-piece operated in positive pressure mode.

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Accidental Release Measures **Spill Clean Up:** Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see section 8). Stop leak if without risk. Move Containers from spill area. Dilute with water and mop up if water-soluble or absorb with an inert dry material and place in an appropriate waste disposal container. Dispose of via a licensed waste disposal contractor.

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Handling and Storage

Handling: Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see Section 8). Do not get in eyes or on skin or clothing. Do not breathe vapor or mist. Do not ingest. Keep in the original container or an approved alternative made from a compatible material, kept tightly closed when not in use. Do not reuse container. Wash thoroughly after handling.

Storage: Store between the following temperatures: 4.44 to 48.9°C (40 to 120°F). Store in accordance with local regulations. Store in original container protected from direct sunlight in a dry, cool and well-ventilated area, away from incompatible materials (see section 10) and food and drink. Separate from acids. Keep container tightly closed and sealed until ready for use. Containers that have been opened must be carefully resealed and kept upright to prevent leakage. Do not store in unlabeled containers. Use appropriate containment to avoid environmental contamination.
